

EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

NURSING AIDES GRADUATION CEREMONY

After successful completion of the six-month nursing aide course, 8 students were awarded certificates by the trustees of BHT in the graduation ceremony held on 17th January. The next batch will start from the beginning of June 2020, and we have already initiated the process of admission. We have increased the intake to 20 candidates from now on, and have opened the course for male candidates also.





As part of our Ten-day training program on "Fundamentals of Palliative Care", Karunashraya trained Dr. Sonali Nandi and Dr. Mesbah Uddin from Bangladesh on March 2020.

Ten-day Training Program: 21 nurses from various districts of the state of Karnataka benefitted our Ten-day training program and would eventually use the generated expertise in imparting palliative care to patients within their own organizations. Additionally, 1 doctor from Kolkata, underwent hands-on training in Palliative care to gain knowledge and improve facilities in his parent organization.





National Fellowship in Palliative Medicine and Nursing: Three doctors and 1 nurse spent their 10 days clinical postings in Karunashraya to fulfill their fellowship requirement. These posting helped them to gain enormous knowledge in hospice set up and in-patient palliative care services.

Continuous Medical Education: CME programs are being regularly organized in Karunashraya to update the clinical skills of our staff. In the last quarter, we taught two different topics, namely, basic communication skills and handling difficult questions on a daily basis, and COVID -19 - Novel Coronavirus, to create awareness among everyone.

Case presentations: In order to improve the overall quality of palliative care in Karunashraya, we have started patient's case presentation twice a month. In this context, case presentations were done by Dr. Babita and Dr. Kavitha along with their teams. This helped us to look at different ways of intervention and it has been a learning experience for the rest of the team members.

Participation in Workshop

In January 2020, Ms. Sangeetha (Nursing Tutor) and Sr. Seena Xavier (Nursing Superintendent) participated in the Paediatric Palliative care at ELNEC (End-of-Life-Nursing Education Consortium) held at Wadia Hospital, Mumbai.
