Recognising the increasing demand for palliative care education in India, Bangalore Hospice Trust established KIPCER, a specialized training institute. The goal of counseling sessions is to assist patients and caregivers manage emotional distress. Through artistic mediums like sketching, allow them to express their feelings in a healthy manner. ANNUAL SPORTS DAY CELEBRATIONS














ART EXHIBITION

WORKSHOPS & PROGRAMS



Refresher Course for Volunteer Counselors

A one-day refresher course was conducted to enhance the skills of volunteer counselors from the Indian Cancer Society, enabling them to effectively support cancer patients and their families



Volunteer Training Program

Two training programs were organized to equip volunteers with essential skills for palliative care, including communication, social and spiritual concerns, and caregiver support.



Psycho-Oncology Workshop

A 2-day workshop was conducted for the Masters students in Psycho-Oncology from Christ (deemed to be) University. The students attended a workshop on addressing the psychological and emotional needs of life-limiting illnesses, emphasizing communication techniques, spirituality, advanced care planning, and psychotherapy integration.



Neuropalliative Care Workshop

Karunashraya conducted a two-day training for Indian neurologists, led by experts in the field. The training focused on improving neurologists' skills in prognostication, ethics, and communication within the context of neuropalliative care.

Training of Trainers (ToT)

The National Health Mission, Odisha, organized a comprehensive training program at KIPCER for healthcare professionals specializing in palliative care. Over a threemonth period, six batches were conducted, engaging a total of 75 participants, including 27 doctors, 26 nursing officers, and 22 physiotherapists. The training encompassed both facility-based and home-based palliative care modalities.







Rhythm Rx: Dose of Dance

The India Hospice and Palliative Care Nurses Association and Karunashraya hosted a two-day workshop, "Rhythm Rx-Dose of Dance," to delve into the therapeutic power of dance in healthcare. Led by UNESCO-certified art therapist Stephanie Hofer, the workshop offered interactive sessions to explore dance as a complementary therapy. The event was expertly organized by Sr Hanife.

Systematic Review Workshop

A three-day workshop was conducted to enhance the skills of researchers in conducting systematic reviews, led by Dr. Divya Sussana Patil and Mr. Elstin Anbu Raj S from Public Health Evidence South Asia, Manipal Academy of Higher Education.





Seeing the Unseen

The 'Seeing the Unseen' workshop in Siliguri was designed to help healthcare workers recognize and address the emotional and spiritual needs of patients and their families. Backed by the Indian Association of Palliative Care, this KIPCER program equips doctors, nurses, and volunteers with the necessary skills.

Spirituality in Palliative Care Workshop

A three-day workshop focused on the role of spirituality in palliative care, aiming to improve healthcare professionals' understanding and skills in spiritual assessment and support. The workshop was led by Prof. Santosh K Chaturvedi, Dr. Nagesh Simha, Dr. Seema R Rao, and Ms. Michelle Normen.





IAPCON Conference 2024

Bangalore Hospice Trust-Karunashraya (BHT-K) had a significant presence at the IAPCON Conference 2024 in Ahmedabad. The organization showcased its innovative palliative care services through a variety of media, including five e-posters, six oral presentations, and a pre-conference workshop. The BHT-K team's active participation in panel discussions and judging of poster presentations further solidified the organization's reputation in the field of palliative care.

Dr. Nagesh Simha was invited as a speaker in the session on palliative care in oncology at the '8th Bangladesh International Cancer Congress (BICC) 2023' held in Dhaka on "The Potent Power of Palliative Care in Oncology". He also conducted a workshop on handling difficult communication with patients and families.



World Hospice and Palliative Care Day



Karunashraya hosted a series of Instagram live sessions to commemorate World Hospice and Palliative Care Day. Notable speakers such as Dr. Nagesh Simha, Dr. Babita Varkey, Ms. Sangeetha N, Mr. Shankar Shrestha, Dr. Seema Rao, Dr. Sravanthi Maya, Mr. Mathew George Chandy, Mr. Girish K and Ms. Keshav Sharma particepated. These four-week seminars, which had as their theme "Reliving Pain, Restoring Dignity: The Heart of Palliative Care," illuminated important facets of palliative care and its importance.

Dr. Seema R. Rao was invited to share her expertise in the field of palliative care at two significant events. Firstly, she was invited as a faculty member to a certificate course in palliative medicine organized by MNJ Institute of Oncology and Regional Cancer Center in collaboration with the Government of Telangana and Pain Relief and Palliative Care Society. Secondly, she was selected as a speaker at the prestigious 18th World Congress of the European Association for Palliative Care (EAPC) in Rotterdam, The Netherlands, where she presented on the critical topic of ICU Palliative Care.



CERTIFICATE COURSES

BHT-KIPCER offers two certificate courses designed to enhance palliative care practices in India. The first course, "Essentials of Palliative Care," is tailored for medical professionals, including doctors and nurses. It aims to integrate palliative care principles into routine clinical practice by focusing on effective communication and the management of complex symptoms. The second course, "Counselling Skills in Cancer and Palliative Care" is to improve the counselling landscape in palliative care in India. KIPCER launched the first ever 6-month blended learning program for psychologists and social workers. 17 candidates successfully completed the course accredited by MAHE, which was delivered by national and international experts.





Dr. Seema R Rao, invited by the Divecha Centre for Climate Change, IISc, Lakeside Education Trust, and the International Pediatric Association (IPA), spoke about The Role of Karunashraya in caring for terminally ill cancer patients" on International Quality of Life Day. The session was led by Prof J Srinivasan and Prof Dr. H. Paramesh, and attended by scientists from the Indian Institute of Science.

Mrs. Sangeetha Murugan was a guest faculty member at a sensitization program for community health officers hosted by the Government of Karnataka, Additionally, she collaborated with Sr. Hanife Mac Gamwell to conduct a comprehensive training program for nurses in Sri Lanka, focusing on hospice care principles and practices. She was also a faculty member at a colostomy care workshop at St. John's Medical College and Hospital, Bengaluru.















Financial Year Home Care Data 2023-24
